'Resilient facilities and services'

- Residency training should aim at training students who can prepare for and effectively respond to emerging crises. They should maintain their core function and adapt to new conditions which may require reorganization.
- This is partly addressed by a robust curriculum designed with content that seeks to train a FP with additional skills, knowledge and insight to comprehensively and continuously manage and co-ordinate individuals' health. Additionally, the institution adopts innovative teaching strategies that ensures the FP remains a lifelong learner and research oriented.

Innovative teaching strategies

- Student directed learning (patient based, learner centered)
- Effective supervision and guidance by core faculty as well as specialist from other fields
- Adopting simulation in teaching skills
- Regular formative evaluation and feedback
- Collaborative teaching with other institutions (MGH and Mumbile)

Curriculum design

- Contains core Family medicine program content as well as Emergency Medicine – (30% content EM)
- Resent curriculum review included emerging infectious diseases (Covid 19)
- Health systems management and health policy and advocacy are isolated courses in the program.
