

Lessons learned from PRImary Health Care Leaders Education: Developing leadership in primary care education in Malawi and Zambia

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Main aims

- Strengthen health systems in Malawi and Zambia by improving the quality and quantity of trained primary care professionals.
- Build institutional capacity in education, research, and leadership in PHC.



Objectives 1

1. Strengthen Education and Research Programs

- Develop/revise 12 curricula/modules at Bachelor, Master, and PhD levels.
- Establish and enhance pedagogical support units at partner institutions.
- Integrate **e-learning** and digital education infrastructure.

2. Build Staff and Student Capacity

- Support PhDs and Master students in Family Medicine and Public Health stude with scholarships.
- Provide pedagogical training, research mentoring, and academic writing support.
- Build on established joint PhD programs UoB and the University of Zambia



Objectives 2

- 3. Engage Stakeholders and Disseminate Knowledge
- Host two PRIMAFAMED conferences, publish policy briefs, and promote knowledge translation.
- 4. Improve Infrastructure for Digital Learning
- Renovate lecture rooms and district teaching sites.
- Install digital/online education tools and improve internet connectivity.
- Develop/support online PHC leadership courses. Two rounds involving the AfriWon research network.



Expected results

- Increased number of qualified PHC professionals in Malawi and Zambia.
- Improved curricula and teaching quality in PHC education.
- Strengthened institutional capacity for research and training.
- Enhanced stakeholder collaboration and policy influence.
- Sustainable academic and professional networks through South-South and North-South partnerships.



Key Implementation Challenges

- Human resources. Faculty, supervision
- Changes in the leader group
- Infrastructure and technology (internet, power)
- Research barriers. Ethical approvals
